General Description:

The 26 Ga. PBU Metal Roofing panel is minimum 26-gauge galvalume steel panels with an optional paint finish. The metal roofing panel is a through fastened panel with a maximum coverage of 36". The panel has 3/4" tall major ribs at 6" O.C. The 26 Ga. Steel material is ASTM A 792 Grade 80, with a 80 ksi yield point with optional painted finishes.

Limitations:

Roof Framing: The metal roofing panels must be installed over minimum 16 Ga. open steel framing.

New Roof Framing Attachment: The roof framing must meet or exceed the uplift requirements of the IRC or IBC and be install as required for resistance to wind loads.

Design Wind Pressures: The design pressure load resistance must be as specified in Table 1.

Roof Slope: The metal roofing panels may be installed on roofs with a roof slope as low as 1/2:12 if sealant is used on the panel side laps. If sealant is not used on the panel side laps, then the minimum roof slope is 3:12.

Installation Over an Existing Roof Covering: Not permitted.

Installation:

General: The metal roofing panels must be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommend installation instructions and this evaluation report.

Underlayment: N/A.

Steel Framing: Minimum 16 Ga. Steel framing at spacings listed in Table 1.

Attachment of Metal Roof Panels to Steel Framing: The metal roofing panels must be fastened to the steel framing with $#12-14 \times 1-1/4$ " Cupped HWH SD with EPDM washer or equal. A line of fasteners must be located along each steel frame at spacings listed in table 1. The fasteners must be long enough to ensure a minimum penetration of three pitches below the steel framing.

Panel Side Laps: The panel side laps are stitched together with minimum $1/4-14 \times 7/8$ " Cupped HWH SD1 with EPDM washer or equal at 20" O.C.

Panel Ends: As required by the manufacturer.

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Trims, Closures, and Accessories: Components such as eave, rake rim, rake trim, hip trim, and valley trim must be as required by the manufacturer.

Alternative Fasteners: Alternative fasteners of equal or greater strength may be substituted.

Note: Keep the manufacturer's installation instructions available on the job site during installation. Use corrosion resistant fasteners as specified in the IRC and the IBC.
